ESEA Reauthorization

Throughout this week educators, parents and communities across the country are participating in a week of action to send a strong message to Congress to shift the focus back to student learning and opportunity, and away from testing, labeling, and punishing schools.

Background

Members of the House and Senate are focused on ESEA reauthorization. It is the most serious effort to rewrite the law, better known as No Child Left Behind, since it passed in 2002. The reauthorization of ESEA as an opportunity to set a new vision of shared responsibility for a public education system that promotes opportunity, equity, and excellence for all students.

Member engagement in ESEA reauthorization is important because changes in ESEA will have profound effect on the state level in our assessment and accountability systems.

Through ESEA reauthorization, we are advocating to:

- 1. Decouple high stakes testing from accountability. One test score doesn't tell you what is actively happening in the school or in the classroom.
- 2. Reduce the number of tests students are required to take at the federal level. Efforts in the Colorado legislature to reduce testing would link the number of tests to what is mandated at the Federal level; if the U.S. Congress reduces the number of tests, Colorado automatically does as well.
- 3. Empower educators with professional authority. The ability of teachers to make decisions has slowly been stripped away. Educators need to be involved in decisions such as how best to engage parents, curriculum, professional development design, etc.
