

## Seven Things To Do In The Next Seven Days

### Number One - If You Aren't Registered To Vote

If you want to register to vote online any time between today and the Coordinated Election, on November 3, 2015, you may. However, because it is too late for your county clerk to mail you a ballot, you must visit one of your county's Voter Service and Polling Centers to get a ballot. [Check here](#) for Voter Service and Polling Center locations.

### Number Two - If You Didn't Receive Your Ballot or Misplaced Your Ballot

Go to the Elections Department with a photo ID and they will disqualify the ballot you have lost and replace it with a new ballot. The addresses for these offices in Colorado Springs are available [here](#).

### Number Three - Deliver Your Ballot to A Drop Off Location

Deliver it to a drop off location. It is too late to rely on the mail to deliver your ballot in time to be counted. The deadline to drop off your ballot is Tuesday, November 3 by 7 p.m. If your ballot is not turned in on time, your vote won't count! Drop off locations are available [here](#).

### Number Four - Need A Ballot Delivered?

### Number Five - Make Sure Your Family, Friends, and Neighbors Vote

Please be sure you are talking with family members, friends and neighbors to encourage them to vote in the election. You may also talk with fellow teachers to make sure they have voted. During the contracted workday, you may not campaign for candidates. Instead, keep the conversation focused on voting. Outside of the contracted workday you may have conversations about the candidates.

### Number Six - Volunteer to Contact Voters This Saturday
