Read Across America- Create and Celebrate a Nation of Diverse Readers

Excerpt from President Schott's Comments to Board of Education February 24, 2021

The NEA reveals that "in 1985, less than 1 percent of children's books spotlighted Black characters... In 2015, children were about five times more likely to encounter a talking truck or dinosaur on the page than a Hispanic character."

It's important for all kids to see themselves on the pages. It allows them to connect and see relevance in reading. Perhaps more importantly it demonstrates their place, their legitimacy as participants in their own world. Children learn from everything, and inclusion is a powerful message.

*The CSEA Equity Council has developed and currently is assisting teachers in performing an equity audit of their classroom Libraries. We are following up with **books** to help fill equity gaps, focusing on NEA's recommendations for titles that foster inclusiveness, cultivate compassion, and activate young citizens, for example. Our hope is that children can find a pathway to value and joy in books, as well as a gateway to empowerment, stewardship, and community.*
