Know your Rights - Representation

Article 3.E.2.e., contains a very important idea – that of representation. ***You have the right to a representative at any meeting as long as you request it.*** If management is contemplating discipline, you can delay the meeting until you have representation secured. Asserting this right is important, as management may want to “move things along” or “get to the bottom” of a situation so they exert soft pressure on you to answer questions without a representative. Our advice is to slow down, not answer questions until a representative is available, and protect yourself from false allegations.
